CAMPUS IMPACT AWARD

The Campus Impact Award recognises a recreation initiative which has had a positive impact on the wellbeing of the student community.

The purpose of the Campus Impact Award is to celebrate and promote collaborative initiatives which have a significant, meaningful and positive impact on students through the provision of recreation activities, whether sport, fitness/gym or health related.

A positive impact could be an increase in participation, evidence of increased student wellbeing or a significant positive change in the recreation environment (infrastructure, staffing, delivery).

Evidence of a strategic impact approach to inclusion, equity, innovation and collaboration will also be considered.

Initiatives may be new or existing but must have had at least one iteration in the year of or preceding the Awards.

Criteria

The winners of the award will be recognised for their outstanding impact based on:

Rationale

- An ability to show evidence of deep understanding of their community/population group.

Scope

- Working in partnership with others.
- Evidence of a strategic impact approach to inclusion, equity, innovation and/or collaboration.

Impact - Current and Expected

- How the initiative has empowered others to lead and take action.
- Taking a holistic approach to meeting the needs of students.

Other

Applicants must be able to provide evidence that the initiative taken has effectively responded to a challenge or opportunity. This doesn't have to mean huge numbers, but it should involve meaningful impact.

Entry Form

The entry form is a question-and-answer format, with a strict word limit. Answers in the form of bullet points are acceptable where appropriate.

Entry Form Questions

(Approx word limit in italics)

Background

Initiative Title *(25 words)*

Initiative summary (what does your initiative focus on and why)? *(250 words)*

Rationale

Tell us how you went about understanding the community/population group you worked with? *(500 words)*

Scope

Who was involved and what was their role? *(300 words)*

Tell us how your initiative considered aspects such as inclusion, equity, innovation and/or collaboration. *(300 words)*

Impact

Tell us how you have empowered others to lead and take action. *(250 words)*

How has the initiative resulted in positive outcomes for students (other key groups where relevant) *(500 words)*
