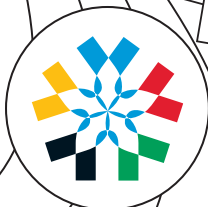


➤ INVITATION

THE CITY



Budapest is the capital city, as well as the sports capital of Hungary. A central and likeable city with a unique, youthful atmosphere, a world-class classical music scene as well as a pulsating night life increasingly appreciated among European youth and, last but not least, an exceptionally rich offering of natural thermal baths, Budapest is one of Europe's most delightful and enjoyable cities.

Budapest, as a large city with favourable geographical features (climate, diversity of hills and plains, thermal waters and baths) is able to satisfy the population's leisure-time, communal and competitive sports needs to the highest standards. More and more people do physical exercise in the city on a daily basis, and based on the attitude of its residents and the oppor-





tunities this city has to offer, Budapest is, on the whole, not only a sports capital but is also a sports city, as visitors may themselves experience, making it more than just a youthful city.

Cited as one of the most beautiful cities in Europe, its extensive World Heritage Site includes the banks of the Danube, the Buda Castle Quarter, Andrassy Avenue, Heroes' Square and the Millennium Underground Railway, the second oldest in the world.

Other highlights include a total of 80 geothermal springs, the world's largest thermal water cave system, second largest synagogue, and third largest Parliament building.

At present, there are 65 higher education institutions in Hungary; two-thirds of them in the capital. The universities of Budapest, with a history dating back hundreds of years, are also popular amongst foreign students today, the number of whom rises year after year.

For the FISU Forum 2020 participants Budapest is easily accessible by road, rail and air. Budapest's international airport, Liszt Ferenc International Airport is situated on the south-eastern edge of the city; both the sports facilities and the accommodation are easily accessible by road. Trains coming from abroad (Vienna, Bratislava) usually arrive at Keleti Railway Station. Budapest's public transport network is highly extensive; there are four metro lines and tram, trolleybus and bus services. The city's night time public transport system also operates.

THE HOST

The University of Physical Education (TE) and its institutional predecessor is one of the oldest higher educational institutions in Europe in the field of body culture, including sports and education. The proposed facilities for the holding of the 2020 FISU Forum are the facilities of the newly built campus of the University of Physical Education. The central building serves the needs of the university starting September 2018. By hosting the European Universities Bridge & Chess Championships in 2019 the university made its first step towards becoming a regular host of international university sport events, followed by the FISU Forum in 2020.





The infrastructural development project is currently in progress. A facility of over 90,000 m² is under construction, to be completed by 2023.

Regular recreational sports programmes will be held at the university facilities, led by highly qualified coaches, trainers and well-known athletes (olympic and world champions). The facilities of the newly built campus of the University are equipped with the most modern technical equipment, not only serving the needs of higher education, but also being capable of fulfilling all requirements regarding large events and conferences. The special needs of an international forum will be met with the installation of top-quality equipment provided by the University.

THEME AND SUBTHEMES

Main Theme: “Seventy Years onward and still going strong: How can FISU continue sustaining the University Sports Movement’s legacy?”

CONDITIONS OF PARTICIPATION

The delegations of the participating countries will be composed of a maximum of four (4) representatives. At least two (2) of them must be students (male and female). The number of the officials is restricted to two (2).

Only the students who satisfy the following conditions may take part at the FISU Forum 2020, according the FISU general regulations:

- Be a national of the country they represent;
- Be at least 17 and less than 25 years of age on January 1st in the year of the event; for 2020, student participants must be born between January 1st 1995 and December 31st 2002.
- Students who are currently officially registered as proceeding towards



a degree or diploma at a university or similar institute whose status is recognised by the appropriate national academic authority of their country;

- Former students of the institutions mentioned in the previous point who have obtained their academic degree or diploma in the year preceding the event;

ENTRY DEADLINES

- General entry: February 12, 2020
- Quantitative entry: May 12, 2020
- Individual entry: July 12, 2020

All entries must be submitted via the FISU on-line accreditation system at accreditation.fisu.net/Pages/EP.aspx



FINANCIAL CONDITIONS

The participation fee will be applied in accordance with FISU Regulations: 70 Euro per person per night.

All extra cost for bank transfers should be worn by the participants!

ENTRY PERMITS TO HUNGARY

From December 21, 2007 Hungary is a member of the Schengen Area, and applies the Schengen legislation in full.

Significant changes subsequent to Hungary's Schengen-membership are that

- visas and residence permits issued by one of the Schengen States are valid also for Hungary,
- visas issued by Hungarian representations abroad and residence permits issued by Hungarian national authorities are also valid for the entire Schengen Area.

Please note that the latest amendment of the Article 5 (1) (a) of the Schengen Borders Code (entered into force on 19 July 2013) introduces new criteria for travel documents of third-country nationals entitling to cross the borders:

- the validity of the travel document shall last until at least three months after the intended date of departure from the territory of the Member States. In a justified case of emergency, this obligation may be waived;
- the travel document shall have been issued within the previous 10 years.

Please check the list of countries, which citizens may travel to Hungary without visa (Visa Waiver Agreements) at konzulizsolgalat.kormany.hu/visa-waiver-agreements.



Visas have to be applied for at your nearest Hungarian Embassy. Please note that conditions of entry to Hungary can change and all WUOC 2016 participants are advised to keep abreast of the current situation by consulting their local Hungarian Embassy.

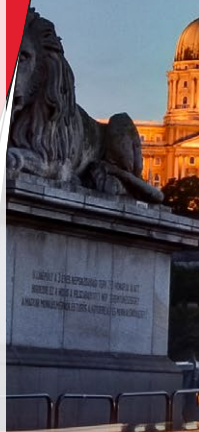
▶ ACCOMODATION, TRANSPORTATION

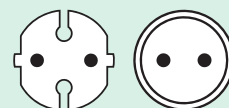
USEFUL INFORMATION
